Island Harvest serves as the bridge between those who have surplus food and those who need it. Our staff and volunteers pick up good surplus food from supermarkets, delis, caterers, hotels, wholesalers, and distributors. Then, they deliver it, free of charge, with a network of 470+ soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, community centers, and other places where those who need it can have access to it, all across Long Island. Since our inception in 1992, Island Harvest has delivered more than 43 million pounds of food, supplementing more than 33 million meals.

In support of our mission to **end hunger and reduce food waste on Long Island**, we are actively involved in educational and hunger awareness programs to inform the public about the insidious but often unrecognized problem of hunger here, in one of the wealthiest regions of the country, and how individuals, businesses and schools can make a difference.

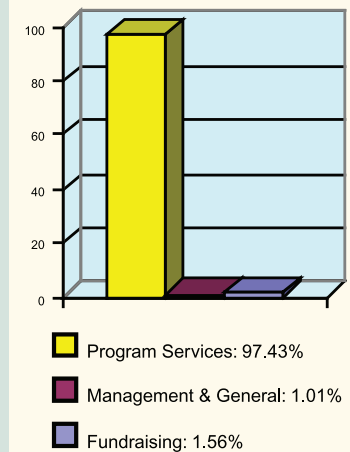

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO



Dear Friends,

The amazing Board, volunteers, and staff at Island Harvest – and the countless Long Islanders that I talk to on a daily basis – share our mission that no one should go hungry, especially when there's something we can do about it.

Using resources that we already have, Island Harvest provides critical food support – thousands of pounds a day, millions of pounds a year – to tens of thousands of Long Islanders who struggle to put food on their tables. Our mission is to *end hunger and reduce food waste on Long Island.*

In 2006, we realized that given our strong ties with schools, communities, and our network of member agencies, we could do more. That's why in October, we launched two pilot initiatives

that I'm proud to say will become part of the permanent Island Harvest landscape.

The first, *The Kids Alliance – Weekend Food-To-Go Program*, gives backpacks of nutritious, shelf-stable food to hundreds of schoolchildren for whom a school lunch is their primary source of nourishment, and a solid meal on Saturday and Sunday is no guarantee. The second, called *Bridging the Educational Divide*, helps our member food programs provide their clients with important information and skills to make them less reliant on emergency assistance.

You'll read more about these, as well as our food rescue, relief, and education programs, in the following pages.

It's hard to believe that right here on Long Island at least 259,000 of our neighbors, friends, and relatives – including 93,000 children and 39,000 seniors – struggle every day to make ends meet. But when you get beyond these numbers, you see that each face of hunger has his or her own story. *Like the New Hyde Park woman suffering from mental illness, whose food stamps were canceled because her daughter got a minimum wage job. Or the accountant, with a young family, downsized after 20 years of service, who now works at a hardware store for an hourly wage. Or the retiree whose pension and social security does not cover rent, food, and unpaid medical bills resulting from a quadruple bypass. Or the home health aide supporting a teenage son in Uniondale, who does not make enough to make ends meet.*

That's why we take our work at Island Harvest so seriously, always seeking new ways to alleviate this growing problem. As always, we appreciate – and rely on – the support of our contributors and food donors. Please contact me or any of our staff for more information about our programs and services, to get involved as a volunteer or food donor, or to help by making a contribution.

## FOOD RESCUE

Island Harvest rescues surplus perishable and non-perishable food from supermarkets, delis, caterers, restaurants, and other businesses. We also receive canned and packaged goods from distributors and manufacturers, as well as food drives organized by schools, companies, and civic groups. The food is then immediately delivered to our sizable network of emergency food programs and community-based nonprofit member agencies all across Long Island.

### 2006 HIGHLIGHTS:

- In 2006, Island Harvest rescued seven million pounds of food, supplementing more than 5.4 million meals.
- Island Harvest collects food from 600 commercial donors. This represents an increase of 100 over 2005.
- Nearly 130 companies, schools, civic and religious organizations, government agencies, and other organizations conducted food drives for Island Harvest.
- About 1,000 active and trained volunteers contributed 55,000 hours of their time in 2006.
- Island Harvest has a fleet of seven refrigerated and non-refrigerated trucks and vans. Volunteer and staff drivers use these to pick up and deliver large food donations.
- It costs Island Harvest just 21 cents to rescue one pound of food.
- Each pound of food rescued by Island Harvest is one pound that does not enter the waste system – as such, food rescue has a powerful environmental benefit.

### SOLUTION:

If you are a caterer, hotel, restaurant, or company cafeteria, consider donating your surplus food to Island Harvest. We will provide you with food storage supplies, free of charge, to make it easy, convenient, and safe to set aside your surplus product. In addition, these supplies will allow us to present the food to those in need in a dignified manner.

Island Harvest supplies hundreds of community-based nonprofit organizations on Long Island with critical food support to help stem the advancing tide of hunger in our communities.

**2006 HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Island Harvest delivers food to a network of 440+ soup kitchens, food pantries, Head Start programs, senior programs, community residences, and other emergency and non-emergency food programs. This represents an increase over 2005.
- All Island Harvest food delivery is donated to our network. This allows member agencies to divert scarce funds from purchasing food to enhancing their own services.
- To distribute food more efficiently, Island Harvest conducts regional distributions at eight locations across Long Island, where we distribute one or more truckloads to representatives from up to 30 member agencies at the same time.
- Island Harvest’s high-profile Annual Turkey and Trimmings Collection Campaign supplies holiday turkeys – more than 7,500 in 2006 – for families who cannot afford them.

**SOLUTION:**

Obesity can be a sign of hunger. Many foods that are higher in fat and carbohydrates are also cheaper and more accessible to people facing poverty. While solutions include a fitness regimen, a change in diet is essential. With good planning, frozen and canned fruits – as well as fresh fruits in season – can be obtained for less cost than candy. Also, children should not be forced to “finish what’s on their plate;” instead, listen to your child if s/he says “I’m full,” and encourage him/her to eat their veggies first.

Island Harvest’s education programs seek to promote smart choices by food recipients, involvement of the greater community in the fight against hunger, and better nutritional and food safety practices.

Launched in October, 2006, our new monthly *Bridging the Educational Divide* workshop series trains volunteers and staff of our often modestly funded soup kitchens, food pantries, and other agencies to help their clients become less reliant on food assistance. These “train the trainer” sessions are led by guest speakers and Island Harvest staff members, and address shopping on a limited budget; applying for food stamps; obtaining help with housing, health insurance, and utility expenses; and other related topics. To supplement the workshops, we provided attendees with clear, reproducible materials that they could distribute to their clients.

**2006 HIGHLIGHTS:**

- Island Harvest conducted three *Bridging the Educational Divide* workshops in 2006 and scheduled ten more for 2007.
- To complement our staff presenters, Island Harvest has a Speakers Bureau of specially trained volunteers who conduct community presentations.
- Including the Hunger Awareness/Coin Harvest Campaign, Island Harvest conducted 110+ presentations to schools, companies, faith-based, and civic organizations.
- Island Harvest conducted four safe food handling workshops for its network of member agencies.

**SOLUTION:**

“Many older people need help paying for prescription drugs, health care, utilities and other basic needs, as well as food. Ironically, millions of older Americans — especially those with limited incomes — are eligible for but not receiving benefits from existing federal, state and local programs.” The Web site [www.benefitscheckup.org](http://www.benefitscheckup.org), developed and maintained by National Council on Aging, provides extremely comprehensive information on federal, state, and local benefits for seniors.

2006 was a year in which Island Harvest identified new strategies to fight hunger on Long Island. The most significant of these is **The Kid's Alliance – Weekend Food-To-Go Program**, which we launched as a pilot initiative on October 23.

The study *Hunger in America 2006 – Local Report for Long Island* revealed that a shockingly high number of local schoolchildren depend on school lunches and breakfasts as their primary source of nourishment, and may not get a decent meal on Saturdays and Sundays, when school is not in session. **The Kids Alliance Program** provides kids in this situation with backpacks filled with *nutritious, child-friendly, shelf-stable, easy-to-prepare food* to bring home for the weekend.

After clients and consumers from our nonprofit partners help to fill the backpacks, we deliver them to schools each Friday. School staff is responsible for distributing the backpacks discreetly. The program is overseen by Island Harvest's registered dietician.

Our objective in the 2006-07 school year was to serve 450 children in six<sup>1</sup> schools. We finished the year with 462 program enrollees in nine schools. Because of the intense demand for this project, as well as the tremendous response from parents, teachers, and students, we are planning a major program expansion for the 2007-08 school year.

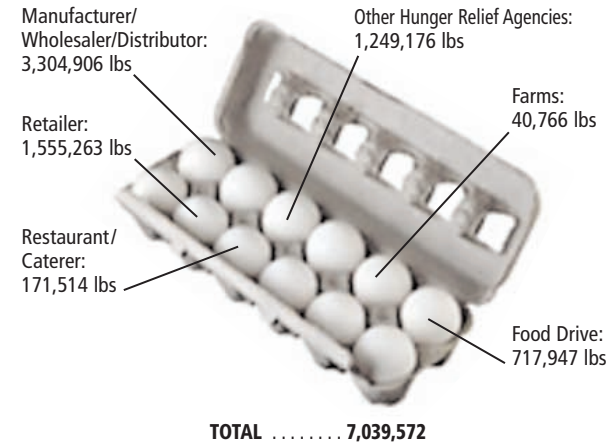
<sup>1</sup> Island Harvest chose school districts where we have strong relationships and that have particularly high percentages of students enrolled in the federal school lunch program. Participating districts include Brentwood Union Free School District, Central Islip Union Free School District, Elmont Union Free School District, Riverhead Central School District, Roosevelt School District, and Westbury Union Free School District.

**SOLUTION:**

Concentration and memory are significantly boosted with the consumption of breakfast. Try to buy cold cereals that are lowest in sugar (under 10 grams per serving), no trans fats and low amounts of fructose corn syrup.

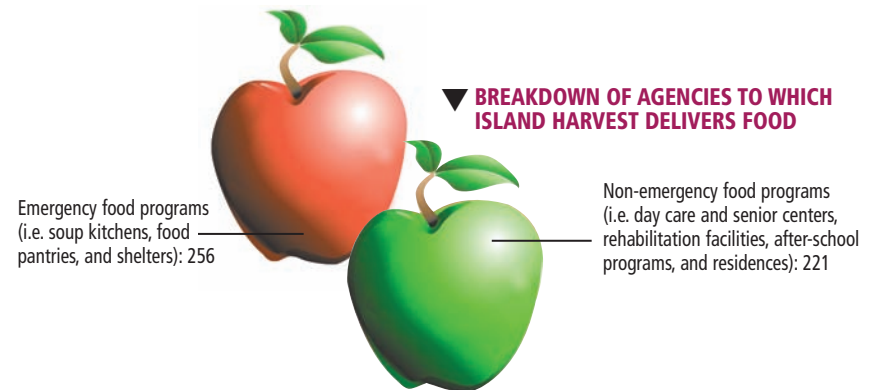
**▼ POUNDAGE DONATED TO ISLAND HARVEST BY DONOR TYPE**
