Marilyn K. Genoa

Marilyn K. Genoa is a principal at Genoa & Associates, P.C., a boutique law firm concentrating in the areas of commercial real estate, commercial litigation, and small business representation, including the representation of cooperatives and condominium associations.

An elected Trustee in the Village of Old Brookville, Marilyn also serves as Deputy Police Commissioner for the Old Brookville Police Department. She has lived in Old Brookville for 30 years. Marilyn and her late husband Paul, to whom she was married for over 27 years until his death in December 2003, raised their two daughters in the Village.

An active member of the Nassau County Bar Association, Marilyn sits on the Board of the WE CARE Advisory Board and is a former member of the Board of Directors of the Bar Association as well as the former and present Chair of numerous committees within the Bar. She has co-chaired the Bar Association's Community Relations Committee's annual Mock Trial Tournament for the past four years.

Marilyn is a past president of the Theodore Roosevelt American Inn of Court and of Yashar, the Attorneys and Judges Chapter of Hadassah, and continues to actively serve on the boards of both organizations. She is on the board of directors of the Nassau County Coalition Against Domestic Violence, and of Congregation Tifereth Israel in Glen Cove, where she serves as Legal Vice President. In May 2009, Marilyn received a National Leadership Award from Hadassah.

Marilyn was a founding member of, and the only attorney in, the committee that established the Gold Coast Library District, where she negotiated with the Nassau County Library System to secure the Gold Coast Library's Charter.

Marilyn is a graduate of Boston University, Adelphi University, and Hofstra University School of Law (Cum Laude). In addition to her two daughters, Jamie and Alexandra, Marilyn has a stepdaughter, Donna, and a granddaughter, Montana, with whom she loves to spend time.

Hon. Denise L. Sher

The Gassman Award, named after WE CARE founder Stephen Gassman, periodically is awarded to an individual who has provided extraordinary service to WE CARE.

Hon. Denise L. Sher is an exemplary leader in Nassau's legal community, serving as a judge and practicing lawyer for more than 30 years. Appointed to the New York State Court of Claims in 2006, Judge Sher is currently Acting Supreme Court Justice in the Nassau County Supreme Court. She also has served as Acting Supreme Court

Justice in the Matrimonial Center of the Nassau County Supreme Court and Presiding Justice of the Integrated Domestic Violence Court.

Previously Judge Sher served as a Nassau County District Court Judge for 11 years. During that time she was a Trial Assignment Judge and was appointed a Supervising Judge of the Court. In 2001, she was the first woman Judge to be elected President of the Board of Judges.

Before becoming a judge, she practiced law as Hempstead Deputy Town Attorney, was a member of the Supreme Court Appellate Division Law Agency and in private practice. She received her law degree from Hofstra Law School and graduated *summa cum laude* from Queens College and is a Phi Beta Kappa.

A tireless worker for community and professional organizations, Judge Sher is a long-term member and supporter of the WE CARE Advisory Board. Her leadership has earned her numerous awards and top honors from organizations including the New York State Fraternal Order of Court Officers, Court Officers Benevolent Association of Nassau County, Hofstra Law School, Jewish Lawyers, Italian-American Court Officers of Nassau County, the UJA Federation of New York and the Nassau County Bar Association.

Judge Sher is a lecturer for the Nassau Academy of Law and chaired NCBA's District Court Committee. She is a former director of the Nassau/Suffolk Women's Bar Association, chaired the Judicial Screening Committee, and is the former secretary to both the Nassau and NYS District Court Judges' Associations. She chaired the Nassau County Judicial Committee on Women in the Courts, the New York State Local Courts Advisory Committee and the New York State Family Violence Task Force.

Island Harvest

Each day over 283,700 Long Islanders, including 110,000 children, face the risk of going hungry. The prolonged economic downturn has greatly affected the ability of many Long Island families to put food on the table; like the working-class family of seven who, after paying all their bills, had no money left at the end of the month and were forced to turn to a local food pantry for help. Or the elderly couple, who were once food donors to local pantries, but now find themselves asking for help.

Fighting hunger and touching lives, Island Harvest serves as the bridge between those who have surplus food and those who need it, supplying over 570 community-based soup kitchens, food pantries and emergency food programs throughout Long Island. A corps of dedicated and specially-trained volunteers collects surplus food from local grocers, restaurants, caterers, food wholesalers, and others, and in turn, distributes it to support the emergency food needs of nearly 65,000 individuals who seek food assistance each week in Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

Formed in 1992 by a woman who was infuriated that food from a local convenience store was being thrown away at the end of the day – with a soup kitchen just doors away – Island Harvest has delivered more than 60 million pounds of food, supplementing nearly 47 million meals since.

In support of Island Harvest's mission to end hunger and reduce food waste on Long Island, the organization is actively involved in education and hunger awareness programs to inform the public about the insidious but often unrecognized problem of hunger here, in one of the wealthiest regions of the country, and how individuals, businesses, schools, and commercial food establishments can make a difference.
